Overall, last summer tied for the secondhottest on record.

It is a sobering thought.

Apart from the extreme heat, the threat of annual hurricanes, along with rising sea levels, means we have to make vigorous

efforts to prepare ourselves more effectively to deal with natural disasters.

And so this 'Community Emergency Response Team' Training is a critical component in our preparedness efforts.

In our 'Blueprint For Change', the platform on which we were elected, my administration pledged not only to improve the government's approach to disaster management, but also to empower the Bahamian people to be better able to help themselves.

This CERT programme is fully aligned with that promise.

Past experience of this programme has demonstrated that the basic skills you have developed will not only support your own physical and psychological needs, but also that of your communities.
